redorchestra2risingstormcrackpassword Torrent DownloadGoogle is planning to launch its own wireless service as early as next year that will run on the same network technology as its fiber-optic service. In a conversation with CNET yesterday, Google Fiber general manager Matthew Papakipos cautioned that a launch date hadn't yet been set, but said the service will likely be available in the middle of 2015. The service is expected to be available in limited areas of the U.S. as part of Google Fiber's Fiber for Business and Fiber for Life partnerships, Papakipos told CNET. The service is expected to cost around \$70 per month and will operate on a similar spectrum to Google Fiber's network. The service may not be available to every area of the country or every home — instead, it will be reserved for small businesses and homes that would otherwise have to pay a cable company to build fiber to their location. Google Fiber's network is designed to have a much lower cost than the existing cable networks. It provides ultrafast internet service over the same fiber optic cable that carries the company's YouTube TV, over-the-air television channels and some local broadcast networks. Google Fiber's network could be more expensive than typical cable or phone lines because the service offers an ultrafast network that also carries video services. The company has built out its infrastructure in Kansas City and Austin, Texas, with other cities on its list. Google Fiber had over 37,000 active customers as of December 2012, and that number is expected to grow as the service becomes available in additional areas. Papakipos wouldn't say when Google Fiber would launch in more areas, but said the company plans to announce the expansion in the next few months.He isn't himself right now." "I can see that."
